(The Blessings on Learning Torah, part 2)

The בּרְכוֹת הַתּוֹרָה express the great importance of Torah study. These blessings must be recited with feeling and with joy as we are thanking Hashem for choosing us as His chosen people from among the other nations, and for giving us His Torah.

We may not study תּוֹרָה or any holy subjects before reciting these בְּרְכוֹת. A person who wishes to study early in the morning before reciting שַׁחֲרִית should recite בַּרְכוֹת הַתּוֹרָה before he begins to study.
