

The משכן (2)

Shulchan - the Table, which had twelve specially baked loaves called לחם הפנים ("show-bread") displayed on it at all times. It was placed near the northern wall of the "Kodesh". On the table were two columns of six shelving tubes (making twelve shelves in all), upon which the twelve loaves of bread were placed each week. The twelve loaves were baked on Friday and put on the Table on the Shabbat, when the old loaves were removed and divided among the Kohanim. The Jewish People would enjoy prosperity (gain money and possessions) through the merit of the bread that was placed on the Shulchan.

שלחן

Menorah - the Menorah had seven branches. It was placed near the southern wall of the "Kodesh". Each of the Menorah's branches was intricately engraved with decorative knobs, cups, and flower-like shapes. Even though the Menorah consisted of many shapes and detailed designs **it was made out of one solid piece of gold.** Nothing could be made separately and then attached to the Menorah. The purest olive oil was used to 'feed' its flames. The Midrash explains that Hashem showed Moshe a Menorah of fire to help him see how to make the real thing out of gold. Moshe still thought he would be unable to make it so Hashem told him to throw the golden ingot into a fire - the Menorah then emerged fully formed from the fire.

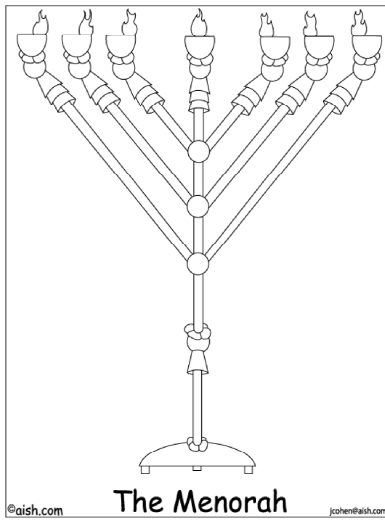
מנורה

Mizbe'ach Haketoret - the Golden Altar, upon which the incense was offered every morning and evening. It was located in the center of the "Kodesh".

מזבח

Kiyor - the copper laver, or wash-basin, in the courtyard (חצר) of the Mishkan.
Before performing the service, the Kohanim were required to sanctify their hands and feet from its water.

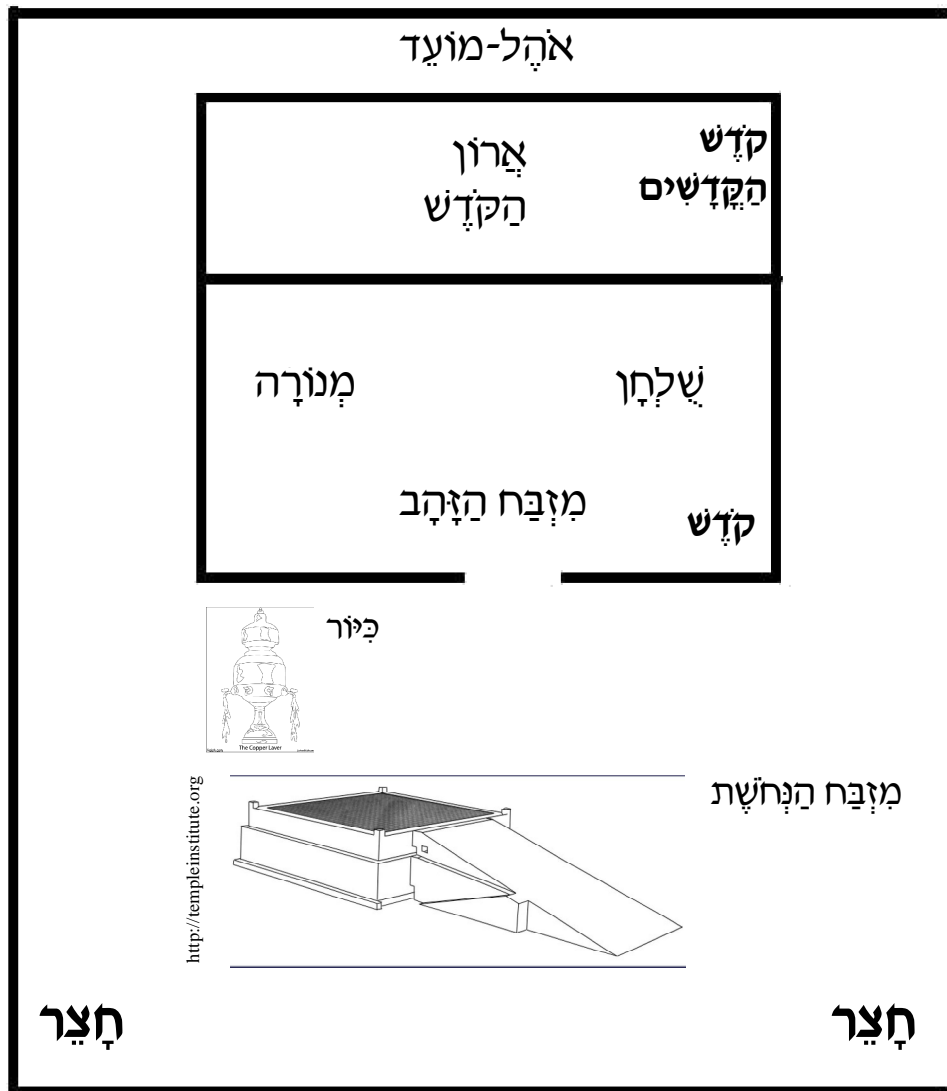
