When You Include Yourself

Adding something derogatory about yourself when you make negative remarks about others does not undo the fact that you have spoken לשון הרע. This includes instances when you mention that you and a friend both did the exact same action or have the same fault, and you begin by talking about yourself.

"Ben and I both used to take sweets from the shop without paying."

"Nobody in our group studies Torah properly."

"I don't give enough tzedaka, but neither does Mr. Stern."
