~ Now children have plenty of questions for the seder...and parents and other adults are well equipped with the answers.

~ Remember, the מצוה is "והגדת לבנך" - these cards provide a (fun) way to ensure children are asking and parents are teaching.

### More Detailed Instructions

Question and answer cards on Pesach and Seder-related information that are a wonderful resource for the Seder and for class review. Cut out these cards and use them for fun, student-directed lessons (there are loads of ways to use them in class!). Use them as preparation material for a grand Pesach quiz or give a set to every pupil to use at the Seder. Now children have plenty of questions for the Seder...and parents and other adults are well equipped with the answers!










Pupils will ask questions (to each other or to parents) and will receive answers to review a wealth of Pesach material in an exciting way.










#### Ideas for class use:










1. Print out the question and answer cards. Laminate for future use. Cut out each card.
2. Children can move around the class asking each other these questions and answering each other with or (for a more difficult exercise) without the answer cards.
3. As they play, the children can swap cards with friends. This activity facilitates the children learning a tremendous amount of material with little or no "chalk and talk" from the teacher.

#### Ideas for the seder:










The cards can be used in many ways. Parents could begin with the answers, with children needing to think of the questions. Adults can dress up as the five Rabbis in B'nei Brak (or just pretend to be them) and the children can be their talmidim coming with questions. (I have had pupils use the cards this way at their Seder.) The cards can be placed under everyone's plates / place mats when the table is laid; they are then informed of their hidden cards later in the evening. A good time for using these is during the meal - "Shulchan Orech" - since there is supposed to be continued relevant discussion at this time to ensure the praises of Hallel before and after the meal are not interrupted. Enjoy!

<p>A1 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>...because it would look like we are eating the meat of the פסח קרבן and we can only do that when we have the בית המקדש.</p> <p>(<b>Extra lesson:</b> The word זרוע means 'arm'. This reminds us that Hashem took us out of Egypt with an outstretched arm.)</p>	<p>A2 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To show the unity of the Jewish People. One represents the כהנים, the second is the לויים and the third is the ישראלים.</li> <li>2. To remind us that we were taken out of Egypt in the merit of the three אבות: יעקב, יצחק, אברהם.</li> <li>3. To remind us of the three measures of flour that אברהם used to bake מצות for the visiting angels.</li> </ol>	<p>A3 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The four cups remind us of the four words Hashem used to describe how he was going to free us from Egypt:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. וְהוֹצֵאתִי - I will take you out</li> <li>2. וְהַצַּלְתִּי - I will save you</li> <li>3. וְגִאֲלֹתִי - I will redeem you</li> <li>4. וְלָקַחְתִּי - I will take you as My chosen people</li> </ol>
<p>A4 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>This shows that tonight we are all like kings, with our own servants to pour for us!</p>	<p>A5 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>הגדה is related to the word מגיד which means "telling."</p> <p>During מגיד We tell the story of how Hashem rescued the Jewish People from מצרים with great miracles and wonders.</p>	<p>A6 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>הגדה means "telling."</p> <p>We tell the story of the Jewish people becoming free and leaving Egypt. On this night we tell stories of our slavery in מצרים and about how Hashem brought us to freedom.</p>
<p>A7 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>We must not forget to eat the אפיקומן right at the end of the סדר meal, and before the middle of the night.</p>	<p>A8 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>If there are no children at the סדר then an adult must ask the four questions in מה נשתנה .</p>	<p>A9 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>Rabbi Akiva did not start learning תורה until he was 40 years old!</p>

<p>A10 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>רַבִּי אֶלְעָזָר בֶּן עֲזַרְיָה thought that people would not respect him because he was only 18 years of age when Hashem chose him to be the leader of בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל . <i>Hashem made a miracle and his beard turned white overnight to make him look older!</i></p>	<p>A11 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>Parents have a מִצְוָה to teach their children all about how Hashem freed us and took us out of מִצְרַיִם. The children in a family will all be different from each other and their parents will need to teach them all in different ways to ensure they understand.</p>	<p>A12 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>When the Jewish People were in Egypt they kept to their own ways of dressing and speaking and they only used Hebrew names. <b>so: CLOTHES, LANGUAGE, NAMES</b></p>
<p>A13 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>לְוִיִּים and אֶהְרֹן were מִשֵּׁה and the לְוִיִּים were never made into slaves. They were able to stay in the land of Goshen and learn תּוֹרָה .</p>	<p>A14 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>This is to teach us that it was Hashem who took us out of מִצְרַיִם . מִשֵּׁה was only his messenger.</p>	<p>A15 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>Rabbi Akiva had 24,000 תַּלְמִידִים (students)!</p>
<p>A16 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The meaning of this song ( דִּינֵנוּ ) is that each of these events was a great blessing and favour for us and would, even by itself, have been enough of a reason to praise Hashem.</p>	<p>A17 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>סֵדֶר מִצְוֹת of the סֵדֶר said that the מִצְוָה can not be fulfilled without explaining, <b>פֶּסַח - the Pesach offering</b> <b>מֶצֶה - the unleavened bread</b> <b>מָרוֹר - the bitter herbs</b></p>	<p>A18 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The process of making the מֶצֶה should take no longer than 18 minutes. The dough will then not rise enough for it to become חָמֵץ .</p>

<p>A19 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>This shows us that even before the Jews went down to מצרים Hashem had already planned their rescue. Therefore, the מצה (freedom) was already in place before the מרור (slavery) had started.</p>	<p>A20 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>Our Rabbis teach us that the meal itself is a part of the הלל prayer and so there is no interruption at all. However, the meal will only be a הלל, a praise to Hashem, if we keep our conversation during the meal to the הנדה and the miracles of the יציאת מצרים!</p>	<p>A21 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The song <b>אחד מי יודע?</b> can be seen as an answer to the the question, “Why did Hashem save the Jewish People from Egypt?” The song lists the merits which made the Jews deserving of being saved: the Ten Commandments, the three <b>אבות</b> (Fathers), the Four <b>אמהות</b> (Mothers), the <b>חומש</b>, the <b>משנה</b>, the twelve <b>שבטים</b> (tribes) and so on.</p>
<p>A22 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The first two nights of פסח are called “סדר Nights” because the word “סדר” means “order” and each evening follows the order set out in the הנדה.</p>	<p>A23 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Red wine is considered superior to other wines;</li> <li>2) Red wine reminds us of the blood of Jewish children that פרעה shed;</li> <li>3) Red wine reminds us of the blood of the קרבן פסח (Pesach sacrifice);</li> <li>4) It reminds us of the blood on the doorposts;</li> <li>5) It reminds us of the plague of blood - דם.</li> </ol>	<p>A24 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) The salt water represents the tears that the Jews shed as they slaved in מצרים;</li> <li>2) The salt water represents the water of the ים סוף which the 600,000 Jews crossed;</li> <li>3) The Egyptian laws forbade eating salt. By dipping food in salt water we show we are no longer under the control of the Egyptians.</li> </ol>
<p>A25 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The removal of some wine from the full cup indicates that one’s ‘cup of joy’ can not be full to overflowing when human lives are being lost, even if these lives are those of enemies such as the Egyptians.</p>	<p>A26 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The reason is that this paragraph was written at a time when Aramaic was the spoken language of most Jews and the Rabbis wanted everyone to understand it, especially the invitation to guests to come to the סדר.</p>	<p>A27 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. לחם עוני means “bread of poverty”; מצה has this name because it has simple ingredients - flour and water - and remains thin and flat.</li> <li>2. מצה was a good food for poor people since it is not digested as quickly as bread; a small amount would keep one satisfied for longer.</li> <li>3. לחם עוני can also mean “bread on which we answer questions” and this is how the seder night works.</li> </ol>



<p>A28 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The בעל ההגדה (author of the הגדה) wants to inform us that this was not an ordinary form of slavery but rather a very difficult one. פרעה was a harsh and stern king and the enslavement in Egypt was very tough and it was impossible to escape.</p>	<p>A29 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>Hashem is called מקום - "Place" - because, <u>"Hashem is the place of the universe and not that there is a universe that is the place of Hashem."</u> The great Rabbi the Chidushei HaRim was offered three rubles if he could answer, "Where is Hashem?" He answered: "I will give you six rubles if you can tell me where Hashem is not!"</p>	<p>A30 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The זרוע (the bone) reminds us of the קרבן פסח (the special Pesach sacrifice) and the ביצה (the hard-boiled egg) reminds us of the קרבן חגיגה (the regular festival sacrifice).</p>
<p>A31 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The חרוסת is made mainly from apples and nuts, as well as other optional ingredients such as pears, dates, figs, pomegranates, ginger, cinamon sticks, and then mixed with wine.</p>	<p>A32 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>The חזרת is the same herbs or vegetables used for the מרור and are used for the כורך part of the סדר, which is when we make a sandwich of מרור in מצה.</p>	<p>A33 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>חרוסת is similar in appearance to clay which is made of straw stubble and water. It reminds us of the clay, or mortar, which the Jewish people used for making bricks during the slavery in Egypt.</p>
<p>A34 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>At the time when we still had the המקדש it was the הלכה (law) that people should wash their hands before eating food which had been washed or dipped in a liquid. Now we only do this on the סדר night before dipping the כרפס vegetable in salt water.</p>	<p>A35 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>... is a ברכה for eating the מצה; ... is for doing the מצוה of eating the מצה at the סדר.</p>	<p>A36 <b>Pesach Seder Question Cards</b>  Children ask ~ Adults Answer!</p> <p>One must recline, or lean, while drinking each of the four cups - the ארבע כוסות, and while eating the מצה כורך and the אפיקומן.</p>
