

## Dvar Torah for Parashas Mikeitz

Paroh says to Yosef:

“I dreamt a dream but no one can interpret it.”

Rabbi Nosson Meir Wachtfogel asks:

But Rashi says Paroh’s advisors gave him several explanations!?

Rabbi Wachtfogel explains:

The Gemoro (Brochos 55b) teaches that the meaning of a dream depends on the interpretation given to it.

Some dreams are neither good nor bad – it all depends on the interpretation.

Paroh didn’t like the interpretations of his advisors, so he said: “No one can interpret my dream.”

Paroh hoped that Yosef would give him an interpretation that he liked more than those he had received from his advisors.
